The Global Language of HEADVEAR Cultural Identity, Rites of Passage, and Spirituality

March 15 - June 7, 2024

This blockbuster exhibition featured 87 hats and headdresses from 42 countries -- a stunning diversity of the world's cultures. More than utilitarian objects, each hat is a work of art, not merely due to the skill required to make it, but also as an expression of creativity and meaning. The exhibition was organized into five thematic sections: Cultural Identity; Power, Prestige, and Status; Ceremonies and Celebrations; Spiritual Beliefs; and Protection. Hats and headdresses communicate timeless ideas—not only of beauty, but also of what it means to be human.

BEHIND-THE-SCENES COLLECTION TOURS

Where does a museum keep 117,000 objects?

Only about one percent of the collection is on permanent display. The rest are cared for year-round by a talented team of highly-trained curators. In 2024, the Collections department started offering monthly themed tours to discuss the particular environmental, handling, and housing factors needed to prevent damage and ensure the preservation of the objects they collect, safeguard, and interpret for present and future generations of citizens. Themes have included weaponry, textiles, rare books, and Mardi Gras.

LIVING HISTORY at COLONIAL FORT CONDÉ

Built on the same site of its 1723 predecessor, this partial reconstruction of Fort Condé offers visitors the chance to learn about Mobile's journey from its beginnings as a French colonial settlement to its early years as an American territory. The Fort is quickly becoming a vibrant living history site, filled with opportunities for visitors to not only learn about colonial Mobile history, but to *experience* it. Living history interpreters perform daily demonstrations and weekend tours, offering exciting new ways to discover our shared past.

Housed in the restored Phoenix Volunteer Fire Company No. 6. Fire House, the Phoenix provides an exciting museum experience for visitors of all ages. Admission is always free.

CULTURE FEST




